Introduction

The survey asks questions about whom you intend to support for the Democratic nomination for President of the United States and Governor of Indiana. To assure the confidentiality of your responses, the survey is conducted entirely by computer. Questions are answered by pressing a number on your touch tone pad. No one will call you back for answering these few questions.

If you have already voted in this primary election, we are still very much interested in your choices and encourage you to participate in the survey.

If you are a registered voter and intend to vote in the May 6 Indiana Democratic primary press 1 now. If you wish to have your number put on our permanent do not call list press 2, or just hang up.*

***All respondents indicated they are registered voters and intend to vote in the Indiana Democratic Primary.**
